



Learning Blog Dosbarth Dewi



We've had another exciting and very busy week in Dosbarth Dewi. In literacy we started to read our new, very funny book called 'Oi Frog'. This is a rhyming book all about a Frog who doesn't want to conform and only sit on logs! We started the week with a hook activity where we learnt lots of new facts about frogs. Mr Camilleri brought in some tadpoles for us to look at and keep in our garden pond. We then played a rhyming matching game where we needed to match an animal with something it could sit on. e.g. cats sit on mats, gorillas sit on pillars and dogs sit on...frogs! By the end of the week we were able to generate a range of different rhyming words all by ourself!

We continued to work on our mini beast inquiry and ventured outside to the forest school area. We went in search of mini beasts, however, this time we used our counting skills to see how many different species we could find. As we saw a mini beast, we recorded it in a tally chart. We returned to the classroom and carefully counted the totals. We discovered that everyone saw lots of woodlice, ants and worms, however, didn't see any bees or butterflies. This got us thinking! Why didn't we see many flying insects? Some of us thought it wasn't warm enough yet, some children thought that there wasn't enough trees about and some of us thought that we needed more flowers to attract them. Next week we hope to plant a range of different plants/ flowers to see if our theory is correct.

We input the results of our mini beast hunt into J2e and produced a pictogram. We used the pictogram to find out how many mini beasts each group found. We also enjoyed some time moulding plasticine to create some of our favourite insects.
